PARISH OF TIMBERLEA-LAKESIDE Minutes of Annual Meeting – 2007 January_27, 2008

The meeting opened at 12:05 with prayer led by Rev. Ron Walker.

Moved by Linda Strachan and seconded by Jinny Giza that Janet Benight act as chair, and that Edith Steffens act as secretary for the meeting. Motion carried.

Moved by Keith Fraser and seconded by Rick Morash that the minutes of the 2006 annual meeting be approved as circulated. Motion carried.

Communications: Janet read a letter from Bernie Conrad in which he resigned from his member-at-large position on Council, two years into his term of three years.

Presentation of List of Insurance Policies: Keith pointed out the list on the financial report of the parish.

The Rector's Report and Associate Priest's reports: No questions from the floor about Rev. Judie's; any questions about Rev. Mike's will be addressed to him on his return.

Wardens' Report: Doug Gillett noted that we have a 2010 committee, the Janet Marshall committee and Parish Visioning committee. He suggested that communication is vital in co-ordinating the activities of these three committees.

Finance Committee: Doug commented that the committee examined the financial figures for the past few years and concluded that there is nothing that can be done to reduce expenditures. He stressed that an urgent matter for the incoming Council should be addressing the problem of declining income.

Keith presented the financial statements for the Parish and St. Andrew's Church. Due to the shortfall in envelope givings, we are dipping into savings; a few years of this will mean the depletion of the savings account. Jinny pointed out that St. Luke's has ended up in a deficit position as well. The congregation at St. Andrew's has remained constant, as has the number of envelopes in use, over the past several years. It was felt that the new Council should address the problem of finances at the February meeting. Tim expressed the opinion that there is potential in the hall and he thinks upgrading the hall might lead to more rentals. Doug replied that the Finance Committee had discussed this, and found that renting the hall would involve having someone to be present and responsible; who would that person be?

Elections: The Nominating Committee presented the name of Linda Strachan for Warden. No nominations from the floor. Linda is Warden by acclamation.

The Nominating Committee presented Nicole Chenell's name as secretary. No nominations from the floor. Nicole is Secretary by acclamation.

Other positions: The Nominating Committee's report is part of the Annual Report, and remains the same with the exception of Bernie Conrad who has resigned. St.

Andrew's and parish treasurer: Keith Fraser; St. Luke's treasurer: Jinny Giza. Synod Delegates: Marilyn Hamlin, Doug Gillett, Erica Orlando (alternate). Property chair- Ken Richardson. Jinny nominated Wendy Wells as Synod delegate. A secret ballot was held and Marilyn Hamlin and Doug Gillett were elected as Synod delegates. Gordon moved the ballots be destroyed; seconded by Tom Richardson. Motion carried.

Parish Auditors and Envelope Secretaries as listed. No further nominations. Acclaimed as listed.

Other committees: Members and chairs of committees as listed.

Regarding the member-at-large position left vacant by Bernie Conrad's resignation: Don Schwartz moved that it not be filled, allowing us to revert back to the original even rotation of two persons being replaced each year. Seconded by Rick Morash. Motion carried.

In closing, Janet stated that she had enjoyed her two years as Warden but is relieved to be retiring. She is pleased to see Bob Angus and Lloyd Miller, two new faces on Council. She thanked members for all the support given over her term of office.

Ken Richardson thanked everyone for their support and he welcomed the new members. He welcomed Linda back as Warden and looks forward to serving along with her.

Rev. Ron expressed thanks to those present as well as the parish in general, on behalf of Rev. Mike and himself. He suggested that installation of the new Council be done by Rev. Mike when he returns home.

Linda thanked all who supported her return to the office of Warden, and she thanked Ken and Janet for their hard work as Wardens.

Gordon Hamlin moved adjournment at 1:00 and the meeting closed with prayer led by Rev. Judie, followed by the Grace.

Rector's Annual Report To the Parish of Timberlea-Lakeside For the Year 2008

As I prepare this report to the parish I am looking ahead in anticipation of good weather and the Annual General Meeting taking place as scheduled. I do so because if all goes as planned at our worship on the 25th, before our meeting, we will celebrate Holy Baptism and it is in the spirit of that sacrament that I begin my comments.

The gospel for this day reminds us of Jesus call to the first disciples. As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the sea - for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, 'follow me and I will make you fish for people.' And immediately they left their nets and followed him. Mark 1: 16-18

In the same manner that Jesus called the first disciples to follow him we, through our baptism, are likewise being called. Our response to that call as individuals and as a parish community is what makes up the contents of this report.

The Book of alternative Services suggests that the meaning of baptism is unfolded in various meanings and images. "Baptism is participation in Christ's death and resurrection." (Romans 6: 3-5) As we came to the end of the year 2008 we came to the end of an era in the life of our parish. The congregation of St. Luke's and St. Luke's Church, having faithfully witnessed to God's word in the community and to God's world, recognized that it would be in their best interests, and the best interests of the parish, to join with the congregation at St. Andrew's. This tiny dedicated congregation has approached this transition with courage, with hope and with conviction that who they have been will be remembered and that what they have begun will continue through the ministry that they now are part of at St. Andrew's. I look forward to seeing the new life that grows from this transition and give thanks for the grace that those involved have demonstrated.

"An enlightenment by Christ" (Ephesians 5: 14) I began the year 2008 on study leave. Clergy are encouraged to take Sabbatical Leave and provision for such leave every five years is made by Diocesan Policy. I wish to thank the parish for their support of this policy and give thanks especially for Rev. Ron and Rev. Judie who carried out liturgical and pastoral ministries during my absence. The focus of my study was *The Theology of Climate Change*. I am convinced that this topic is the most important issue facing us today. The quote that sticks with me most says, "We do not inherit the earth from our ancestors, we borrow it from our grandchildren." Last year during lent I challenged the parish with a number of measures that would help reduce our carbon footprint. As we go forward it is my intent to renew and broaden that challenge to keep this important issue before us. As a church I hope to develop with parish council a plan to reduce our carbon footprint here in the parish. I also hope and pray that all of us will do our share to be good stewards of what God has wonderfully created for us. "A reclothing in Christ" (Galatians 3:27) The actual verse from Galatians reads as follows, "As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourself with Christ." This statement is directed at the individual but I reflect upon in this report in a more corporate meaning. I commend the good work done on the kitchen and the plans to continue renovations to improve the function and beauty of our facilities. As we reclothe our surroundings we are making a statement about our dedication to continue to answer together God's call to us as a faithful worshipping community. I look forward to this work continuing in 2009

"A liberation into a new humanity in which barriers of division, whether sex or race or social status, are transcended." (Galatians 3: 27-28) I was pleased to see the willingness of the parish to resume their ministry to St. George's Soup Kitchen. This outreach ministry of providing a warm supper for less fortunate and homeless residents of our communities is one that touches directly the message of God's call to us. It is a ministry that provides aid to some of our most vulnerable citizens and a ministry that opens the eyes of all who are involved. "As you did it for the least of these, you did it to me."

FORT SACKVILLE REGION ANNUAL REPORT 2008

The year 2008 saw a lot of changes in the Fort Sackville Region. The first of many was the boundary changes for all the regions in our Diocese. Our region gained part of the St. Margaret's Region and lost some of our parishes to the Chebucto Region.

We met three times this past year. Our first meeting of the year was held on April 8th at Emmanuel Church in Spryfield. This was the first meeting with the new boundaries. We welcomed the new members of our region to this meeting. Some of our new members came from as far away as Blandford. The new boundaries were discussed and we were told that all boundary issues would be finalized at Synod in May. It was hoped that each region would have an average of 15 parishes.

At our April meeting we welcomed Rev. Jim Purchase who gave a presentation on the 2010 Celebrations that were being planned. Special hangings and vestments for 2010 have been made by Daphne Gabriel (wife of Rev. Mark Marshall). These can be borrowed by the parishes by contacting Rev. Purchase.

In May we held our Pre-Synod meeting at St. Peter's Church in Birch Cove. Synod would see the election of a new Suffragan Bishop. Our Archdeacon, Rev Ron Cutler, was one of the nominees for this position. We wished him well but would be sad to lose him as our Archdeacon. This meeting consisted of going over the motions and business of Synod. Our Regional Dean, Rev. Mark Kingsbury told us to pray for the right candidate to be elected as our new Bishop. He said that God would help us put the right person in place.

As I said at the beginning of this report, many changes happened in our Region in 2008. Our Archdeacon was elected as the new Suffragan Bishop and Bishop Sue appointed a new Archdeacon for our region. Our new Archdeacon is the Rev. Mark Kingsbury who was the Regional Dean. A new Regional Dean had to be appointed and after much deliberation our Rector, Rev. Mike Conrad became our new Regional Dean.

Our third meeting of 2008 took place on Sunday, October 26th at St. Andrew's Church at 3:00 p.m., followed by a service of induction for our Regional Dean, Rev. Mike. We welcomed the new Trinity Church in Fairview to our Region as well as Hubbards, French Village and Hackett's Cove. Birch Cove, Jollymore and Spryfield are now part of the Chebucto Region.

The regional boundaries were finalized at Synod in the spring. It was decided that regional dues would begin in 2009 and that any money in St. Margaret's Region would stay with that region as not all their parishes were joined with us.

We heard a presentation from Harry Cook of French Village about an Outreach Project to support Jacob Deng of the Sudan complete university over the next two years in Halifax. More information on this will be brought to our next meeting.

Our Region of Fort Sackville now consists of the following parishes: Beaverbank, Bedford, Fall River, French Village (new), Hackett's Cove (new), Hatchet Lake-Terence Bay, Hubbards (new), Mt Uniacke, Sackville, St. Francis by the Lakes, Timberlea-Lakeside, Trinity (new) and Westwood Hills.

2008 has been an exciting year of changes and new beginnings for our region of Fort Sackville.

Several meetings were held throughout the year with at least one of our clergy present at each of them. We were pleased to add Jo-Anne Rector to the membership of the Committee.

The Spiritual Development Committee sponsored, organized, and/or discussed the following:

- Plans were made for a St. Patrick's Pot Luck and Sing Song on March 9 (carried out), an ecumenical service for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity on Feb. 10 (cancelled due to a snow storm).

- Another very enjoyable and well attended Hallowe'en Party and Pot Luck was held on October 24. Approximately 50 parishioners attended; the costumes were many, varied, and extremely clever.

- A Pot Luck, in commemoration of St. Andrew's Day, was held after the church service on November 30 with over sixty parishioners in attendance. I would like to thank Gordon Francis and Myril Wells who brought their guitars and singing repertoire to help with the entertainment after the pot luck meals.

The 90th Anniversary Committee has a number of events scheduled the year 2009. A folder listing these planned events was distributed to all parishioners in the Christmas mailing. We look forward to an exciting year as we celebrate this milestone in the life of our Parish and we hope for enthusiastic participation of all the members of the Parish.

SYNOD REPORT FOR ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING January 25, 2009

The 141st session of the Diocesan Synod of N.S. and P.E.I. was held May 23-25, 2008 at Dalhousie University.

It opened with a Eucharist Service and Dedication of 2010 Celebration Vestments and Paraments, and Processional Cross. The Right Reverend Susan Moxley presided and preached at the service.

An Episcopal Election was held, at which time Archdeacon Ronald Cutler was elected Suffragen Bishop of the Diocese. The Right Reverend Cutler was then congratulated by both clergy and lay delegates.

The theme for Synod was "Companions on the Way", depicting the image of journey that has been with us and will continue with us through 2010, when we will celebrate "A Journey Just Begun".

Bishop Sue issued a warm welcome to the special guest at Synod, Bishop Bill Burrill. He was referred to, by Bishop Sue, as our "Companion on the Way" as the diocese continues its Stewardship journey. In her Charge, the Bishop reminded us that we do not travel alone. We travel side by side and the journey is never static. It is always evolving.

During Synod there were presentations by representatives from such groups as Habitat for Humanity, PWR&DF, Refugee Sponsorship Committee, Planned Giving, Alpha, Fresh Start and the Stewardship Committee. Each group focussed on concerns for one another and for Creation.

The theme of journey and stewardship was also central to several of the motions at Synod.... Environmental Responsibility, Sustainability and Size of Synod, and Sensitivity to Local Industry to name a few.

Outreach Committee Report 2008

The Parishes of St. Luke's and St. Andrew's continue to support the needs of the local communities as well as those in Sichuan, China and Burma.

A total of 130 bags of groceries were donated to the Sacred Heart Food Bank, which serves the communities from Beechville to the Head of St. Margaret's Bay. This amount was slightly down by 12% from last year. Sacred Heart Food Bank depends upon both monetary donations and food donations in order to meet its mandate. Feed Nova Scotia does not provide food supplies to the Sacred Heart Food Bank.

This Spring, Lorne MacLellan had run in the Boston Marathon and through his sponsors, he raised \$ 1,150.00 in funds to be donated to the Sacred Heart Food Bank. We all appreciate the effort he put forth for this worthy cause.

In June, the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) were matching financial donations made towards the humanitarian relief efforts for those peoples who suffered from the cyclone disaster in Burma and the earthquake in Sichuan, China. Five cheques for contributions to the relief efforts in Burma and in China were made from members from the Parish of St. Andrew's to the Primate's World Relief & Development Fund.

On Thanksgiving Sunday, October 12th, St. Andrew's Anglican Church had a food drive and a total of 31 bags of groceries were brought in. On behalf of the St. Vincent de Paul Society, who administer the Sacred Heart Food Bank, Don Boudreau, the President, expressed their gratitude and he duly noted the ongoing support of St. Andrew's Parish over the past five years.

On December 7th, White Gift Sunday, the sum of \$465.50 was raised to assist Feed N.S. with the purchase of turkeys for Christmas dinners.

On December 14th, both Parishes of St. Luke's and St. Andrew's enthusiastically fulfilled "The Christmas Wish List" of the Phoenix Youth by providing beautifully knitted and crochetted caps, mittens, and scarves, home-baked cookies, canned goods, gift certificates for Tim Horton's, bus tickets, toiletries, baby clothing and toys, clothing and shoes for the youth, and suitcases. A "thank you letter" was received from Lori Barker, Director of Fund Development. In this letter, she enclosed the following words from Grace-Ann, who is one of their Phoenix youth and who is a resident of their Supervised Apartment Program – "*You have helped a kid get off the street. Thank you. No matter how small or big the donation, or whether it was an object or money, you're making a difference in someone's life. So, from me and other kids, like me, who need help and got it, thank you so much."*
