Sunday School

The Halloween Potluck & Dance were a lot of fun. About 50 people attended the potluck, many in costume, and the kids had a parade with prizes. And of course the food was yummy! The following Sunday folks were invited to don their costumes for church, and some were indeed very much in that spirit!

Remembrance Sunday was a very special event this year. Members of our local Legion attended, ushered in by a retired RCMP officer in red surge as flag bearer, and followed by Air Cadets, and reps from our Guides, Sparks, Brownies and Pathfinders. We observed Last Post, the placement of wreaths and a solo of In Flanders Fields. A children's talk involved giving youth paper cranes, a symbol of peace, to be placed at cenotaphs, and also on video games at home to remind them not to play war games on Remembrance Day.

This includes a criminal background check and an SOR check. We cannot be careful enough with the safety of our youth and this is an important part of making a safer church.

<u>Blue Christmas:</u> on Thursday Dec 18th at 7pm, St. Andrew's will be having our Blue Christmas service. This is intended for any and all who find Christmas a difficult season to experience. For some it's about feeling lonely, depressed, or being at a point in life when the sense of being surrounded by family and friends isn't as hoped or remembered. Fundraising

<u>Turkey Dinner!</u> Saturday, Nov 29th from 4:30-6:30pm at the St. Andrew's Church Hall. Ticket prices are \$12 for adults, children ages 5-12 are \$6 and under the age of 5yrs are free. A lot of work and good cooking have gone into a wonderful meal! We hope to see you there! Bring your appetite!

<u>Recycling Bottles</u>: we have a St. Andrew's account at the Timberlea recycling depot, and hope that folks might ask the attendants to put their returns on this account. This could be a significant fund raiser over a period of a year, and every little bit helps!

<u>Fundscript</u>: this is a fantastic and easy fundraiser! How it works: you order gift cards for anything you normally shop for, like groceries or gas, or specific shopping from any of the dozens of participating stores, and St. Andrew's receives a small percentage, paid by the company, not you. So for example if you purchase \$100 of groceries each week from Sobey's or Superstore, just order that amount in gift cards. The church receives a 2% to 10% commission on every dollar depending on the store. Again it costs you nothing more than the amount you need for the card you want. A number of parishes in our diocese do this, and in the run of a year easily raise a few thousand dollars with very little effort. It makes a big difference. If you would like to see a full list of stores (there is literally everything from gas stations, to grocery stories, hardware, fast food chains, clothing stores, restaurants, many of the big name franchises here in our area) or order gift cards in any amount, just contact one of our wardens and they will take care of you. Turn around time is one week.
