Duanne Tanswell for his continued (nearly four years now) hard work and spiritual leadership in our Parish which, as always, places heavy demands on his wife Mary and his understanding family.

But it does not reveal the numerous meetings which I attended and participated in. There were meetings of parish and church, various Diocesan meetings which include Regional Council and Synod, meetings of our church groups and parish committees. Also during the year I finished one Confirmation Class in the spring and began another one in the fall. I also supervised three theological students during the year. Cheryl MacFadden in the spring, James Greene during the summer and Gloria McClure in the fall. I faithfully visited the hospitals in Halifax once a week and made many house calls with private communion. I also attempted to do as much house visiting as I could but as always, it seems, I was never able to visit as many homes as I had wished.

This past year we suffered the loss of many members of our church family who will be missed by many. Rest eternal grant unto them O Lord.

We have accomplished much in the parish in 1988 by working together. Two things stand out in my mind., The first is the settlement of the land problem at St. Luke's Church and the second is the siding of St. Andrew's Church. Many other smaller projects were also accomplished which I will not repeat here but rather direct your attention to the various reports in this Annual Report.

I will take this opportunity to thank all of you for your support of me and your church this year. It was and is, so vital and necesary. I am sure that with your continued support and co-opperation we will have an even more successful year than we have enjoyed in 1988. I am always fearful of missing someone or some group by thanking individual persons or groups but I feel that I would be remiss if I did not make an effort to thank some individuals and groups who have worked so hard for their church, parish and Lord. If I miss someone please forgive me for it is not intentional.

I thank all the members of our various committees and councils. Often their work is not acknowledged but we often enjoy the fruit of their labour. Those who will be retiring have well earned a brief rest.

Then there are the various groups. Their accomplishments are great and varied. Thank you to St. Luke's A.C.W. for their support of various parish events and the support of St. Luke's Church. A very special thank you to St. Andrew's Guild who kept St. Andrew's Church financially afluent again this year. A small but mighty band. Also a special thank you to St. Andrew's Men's Club, even smaller in numbers, for the large contribution you have made to St. Andrew's Church by providing a weekly social event and the improvements to St. Andrew's Church HAll. I especially wish to thank St. Andrew's Ladies Group for their valuable contribution to the fellowship of our faith community such as the wonderful Parish Picnic, the Sunday School Teachers Appreciation Dinner and our Baptismal Program.

I will also extend my thanks to the dedicated band of Servers for their faithful service and especially to Bernie Conrad for his leadership. I also value the assistance of the Lay Administrators of Communion whose help is greatly appreciated.

I also wish to thank our choirs at St. Luke's and St. Andrew's and especially to our organists Patricia De'Bell and Girny Giza.

I also wish to thank Wendy Wells who retired as Sunday School Superintendent this past spring. Wendy did a tremendous amount of work for our Sunday School. I would also like to thank Sharron MacKenzie for taking over this important job. I must also thank the teachers for their dedication to the children. A job well done and keep up the good work.

To all those who I have not specifically mentioned I give you my heart-felt thanks for your generous efforts on behalf of our Lord and His Church.

Now I must draw your attention forward to the year 1989 and its many challenges. Everyone's support is needed to make 1989 a success. I ask you to look very closely at our Budgets for the new year and to make a renewed commitment to making ends meet. We will be participating in the Diocesan sponsored 'Stewards At Work' program this year and your support will be needed in both prayer and participation. We are attempting a new Service Schedule and your continued input into this is very important. I also hope to begin this spring a Bible Study Program and a Back To Basic Program for all members of our parish.

There are other areas of need that I feel we should address in 1989. The first of which is our young people! We need to develop a program for our teens but this requires your participation. We need more programs and activities to meet the needs of our seniors. We require a program to visit the sick and shut-ins. Again we need the resources to tackle these areas and you, my brothers and sisters, are the resource. We need your time and talent to begin programs to fit these needs and others not mentioned.

Your continued support of programs such as St. Mark's Food Bank, St. George's Soup Kitchen and the Primate's Fund is asked.

I am sure that with faith in and commitment to our Lord Jesus we can and will make 1989 a successful year both financially and spiritual.

May God bless each and every one of you.

The Parish Rectory is reaching that stage in its life when a number of items are requiring attention. #### 1988 SYNOD

The 21st session of the Diocese of Nova Scotia Synod was held from May 18 to May 20 in Halifax.

The first afternoon was spent hearing reports and extending the courtesies of the house. Minutes of the committees were passed and candidates nominated to various committees. New motions were presented and eight were passed for discussion. That evening a processional of clergy and lay delegates, with the youth carrying the regional banners, entered the cathedral for a Synod Service. Bishop Peter's gave his charge during this service. He spoke of this year's Lambert Conference in the summer. He spoke of the challenge through education of evengelism within the church. He also referred to children being allowed to receive communion, as well as the division of supporters of the B.A.S. and those of the B.C.P. He stressed the need for compassion for those suffering from the disease AIDS. It was also noted that this is an exciting and challenging time for the church.

The following days were busy with discussions and passing of motions. The Five Year Plan was discussed in full and the objectives for the four goals passed. Concern was expressed that the various ministries to the Deaf, Seamen and Health as well as the Curacy Program would be phased out due to lack of funds. We were assured that the cessation of these ministries would not happen.

Much time was spent discussing children and Communion. Concern was expressed by a large number that Confirmation would lose its meaning with early communion. Some spoke of cjildren coming to their parish from other areas of Canada who were accustomed to receiving communion and now found it difficult to understand why they were refused.

The need to increase the interest of the youth and their activities within the church family was emphasized during a presentation by Family Life. This was followed by a service organized by Family Life and presented by the youth.

The various motions were discussed in full. It was passed that a youth delegate from each parish should attend Synod sessions.

A motion for pension provisions for lay employees of the church was referred to the Personnel Committee.

It was agreed to change the name "Eastern Counties" to "Region of The Strait of Canso". A number of other motions were not discussed due to lack of time. Members of various committees were elected.

The last afternoon was spent adopting reports, acknowledging observers and passing of a note of thanks to those whose work made the session run so smoothly. Following a short talk by an observer from Ghana the sessions were closed.

We would like to express our appreciation to the parish for giving

us the opportunity of serving as Synod Delegates.

# 1988 REGIONAL COUNCIL REPORT FOR PARISH OF TIMBERLEA-LAKESIDE



Three Regional Council Meetings, chaired by Fr. Duanne Tanswell, were held during 1988.

The following topics were discussed at each meeting and we heard up-to-date reports from a member of each committee:

A)Diocesan Budget Sub-Committee

The Diocesan Council met in December when they investigated the Sub-Committee's findings concerning:1) The Diocesan Budget

2) Hospital Chaplaincy

3) Family Life Directorship

- B) Five Year Plan-communications for this Five Year Plan is being organized by the Rev. Ruth Jefferson.
- C)Stewardship Plan-Some parishes have already started on this plan which is hoped will deepen our relationship with God and to plan what we can do in the future for our God.
- D)Children and Communion-This debate has now been put into the hands of a Task Force, headed by Father Fred Hiltz and programmes should be in every parish by the beginning of 1989.

In Lent of 1988 the various priests of the region exchanged churches for midweek celebrations and they spoke on seven different subjects e.g. The Lord's Prayer, The Apostles' Creed, the BAS, the Book of Common Prayer. There was a general feeling that the sharing of pulpits was well accepted by the various churches.

At the April meeting it was requested that a Diocesan Task Force be set up to investigate altering the methods for Parishes trying to acquire a new priest. This proposal has gone to the Diocesan Sub-Committee for study. We have been requested by the Diocesan Spiritual Development and Evangelism Unit that we support "Prayers for School Children" in each parish. This programme could be fitted into the Stewardship programme.

Throughout the year, we have been very busy supporting (with both finances and human resources) a variety of functions within our parish, some of which I have listed below:

\* In January, we donated \$200.00 to the typewriter fund.

\* On January 23; a luncheon was held following Confirmation at St. Andrew's, which our group provided sweets for.

\* The group continued support of the Baptismal procedures by enrolling newly baptized children, as well as providing coffee/tea/juice and cake/cookies for the receptions held after such events.

#### SUNDAY SCHOOL ANNUAL REPORT 1988

make our church self-supporting.


